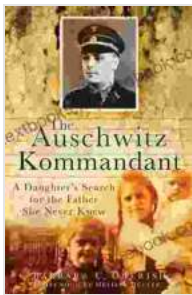


A Daughter's Search for the Father She Never Knew: A Journey of Love, Loss, and Discovery

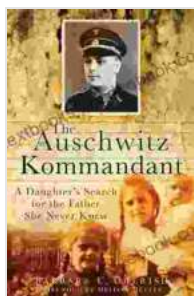

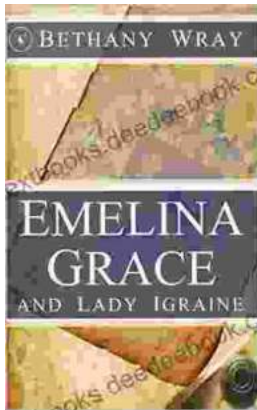
