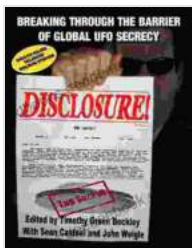


Disclosure: Breaking Through the Barrier of UFO Secrecy

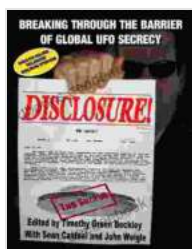

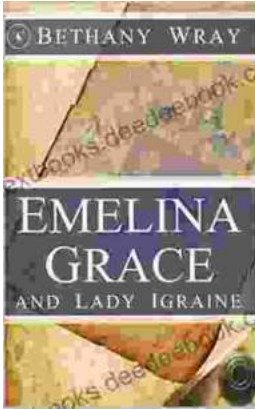
