

"This is Coco," Hartigan said. "She's the dog you kidnapped."


Rizzo looked at the photo, and his eyes widened. "How did you get that?" he asked.

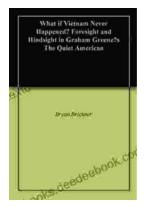
